

- severe or total impairment of sight or the inability to focus or move one's eyes (e.g. low vision or blindness),
 - the inability to hold or manipulate a book (e.g. Parkinson's, MS, broken arm),
 - an impairment relating to comprehension (e.g. dyslexia or brain injury).
- A print disability is defined in the *Canadian Copyright Act* as:
