
Saving and unzipping a file: Firefox

Audio files are very large files. All files are compressed (shrunk) into a .zip folder so that they are faster to download. In order to use the file on a computer, you must first "unzip" the file to make them usable again.

Instructions differ based on the Internet Browser you are using. Below you will find instructions for Firefox.

Go to the <u>Firefox</u> internet browser. Proceed to <u>https://nnels.ca</u> and select an item to download.


- Click on the Download link
- A dialog box will appear. Click the button for "Save File"


When you click "Save File" a big downward facing arrow briefly appears on the top right hand side of the screen.



Then, a countdown for the time remaining appears until the file completes downloading:



When the file completes downloading, the countdown clock turns into a downward facing arrow. Click on the arrow. You will see a list of downloaded files. Instead of the individual files, there is a folder with a zipper on it (and the file ends in .zip). This means that we must "unzip" the folder to access the files:








To unzip a folder:

• Left click on the file that you want to download. A new window opens with a list of files. Click on the button that says "Extract all files"




 A new dialog box appears, which asks you where you would like to save the file. Accept the default and click "Extract"






 A new dialog box, with a list of files will appear. On the far left side of the box, click once on the word "Downloads"



When you click on downloads, you will likely see a few folders. Two of them
will have the same name. One will have a zipper and the file type is
"Compressed (zipped) folder" the other is a "File folder"
